

President Barry Soetoro, the villain of bestseller Coonts's provocative thriller, is due to leave office in five months when he uses a convenient terrorist attack to declare martial law, adjourn Congress, suspend the Constitution and the Bill of Rights, and become the dictator of the United States. He fires CIA director Jake Grafton (last seen in 2013's *Pirate Alley*) and throws him in a federal detention center in West Virginia along with hundreds of conservative politicians and political commentators. Grafton's ex-CIA pal, Tommy Carmellini (also last seen in *Pirate Alley*), decides he's going to bust his old boss out of jail. Meanwhile, Texas secedes from the union and begins seizing U.S. military bases. Soetoro's opponents have a long list of gripes: he's a "self-proclaimed black

messiah," "Soetorocare" is a disaster, and EPA regulations are "designed to save the climate at the expense of the working men and women of Texas." Coonts's excellent action scenes, which shift between Tommy's jailbreak scheme and the civil war with Texas, grind to a halt as characters stop to give fervent speeches about freedom. It will get out of control and we'll be lucky to live through it." He could have been speaking in Steve Coonts' compelling new novel, *Liberty*. Last Stand. In it, Coonts fans will find a thriller master on top of his game. Intricately plotted with a wealth of credible characters, this excellent "what if" novel is deeply layered, addressing political, cultural, military, and legal aspects with equal facility. Coonts' enduring protagonist Jake Grafton is head of the CIA facing a chilling threat. President Barry Soetero uses terrorist actions to declare martial law, dismiss Congress, squash dissent, and imprison political opponents. One detainee is Grafton, tortured to confess plotting against the regime. Grafton's invaluable asset is agent Tommy Carmellini, hero of five novels himself. But before Carmellini can attempt a rescue, events spin out of control. Texas secedes; the U.S. military is divided; rebels

hijack a nuclear submarine and that's for starters. History students know that each revolution is unique, never to be duplicated. And throughout the book, Coonts honors the Universal Law of Unintended Consequences. But at the end we do not know the outcome of the spreading secession movement. Coonts the masterful story-teller leaves us to wonder: What becomes of the United States of America?

Whether or not the reader agrees with the author's side of the current political controversy, this is an interesting book on many levels. Those who believe in government conspiracies will cheer every page. On the other hand, those who deny that the federal government would engage in such activities as eavesdropping on phone conversations and incarcerating individuals without due process whom it sees as threats will loudly decry the story as extreme. Really, no one should be surprised that in the book, Texas seceded because a petition with hundreds of thousands of Texans' signatures supporting secession has been and still is in the Texas legislature now. The story has many characters, but each is described distinctly. The author is concerned why people would choose to rebel or why they would choose to accept extreme government measures and takes the time to explain why the characters made the choice they did. Jake Grafton & Tommy Carmellini, the two recurring characters in Coonts's novels, are central to this story too.

Bought it Saturday, 2 days before the official release and read it straight through. I'm still smiling today! If you've paid attention to the news headlines over the last decade...the last year in particular... and read this book, you'll wonder where Mr. Coonts hid his crystal ball. If you're worried about the elections this fall, you'll want to read this book. And it takes off from there...believable, technically and doctrinally accurate. Thought provoking, and a level-headed treatment of many of the "what if?" questions patriotic Americans have been asking for most of a decade. If you've read his previous books, you'll know the characters. If you served in the military, you will probably identify with some of the characters in their moral quandaries. Understand, this is not a gentle, politically correct book. That it was published as written will surprise many. I suspect the author had to battle with the publisher to do so. I'm glad he did. In fact, I'm waiting for the media fireworks when more folks read the book and the reviews start coming in. Ten bucks says this incredible work makes it on Drudge Report. I don't want to spoil it, so I'm not giving much detail on the plot. But rest assured, it's Coonts' best work ever. Buy it. This is one nobody's going to loan you because it's a keeper you can read again and again when you feel like smiling at rats getting their just desserts.

Stephen Coonts covered the vast scope of this story with deft strokes. He addressed every nuance of the plot, and there were plenty to consider. His characters live on in the readers' minds. Who needs political correctness? It simply gets in the way of the very important and current political narrative. The potential upheaval in the American way of life has every chance of being accurate. The author always delivers a world class story, so this one must be universe class.

I have read much of Stephen Coonts' canon and even presented an academic paper or two on his earlier work. This novel is very dark in that it directly addresses a fear that is festering in our society, a fear of open civil war. It is very prescient and even far sighted in that many of the events described have since come to pass. Now if you are an ideologue of the right, you will probably enjoy this since it reinforces many of your views. If you are a left wing kind of person, you probably better save yourself some antacid and simply agree to disagree (unless you have an open mind not commonly associated with your ideological stance). In any case, as a libertarian, I was much impressed with the events described and have long feared them or something like them myself. I applaud Mr. Coonts and his publisher; this is not for the politically correct or faint of heart.

Want to irritate a liberal? Read this book. Barry Soetoro? Rush Limbaugh? This book could have been pulled from the uncensored newspapers. That it was published and not immediately banned by the current federal administration is nothing sort of amazing. Jake Grafton and Tommy Carmellini again are placed in harms way, this time by the President of the US. The book is accurate, detailed, believable and absolutely will bring a smile to your face.
