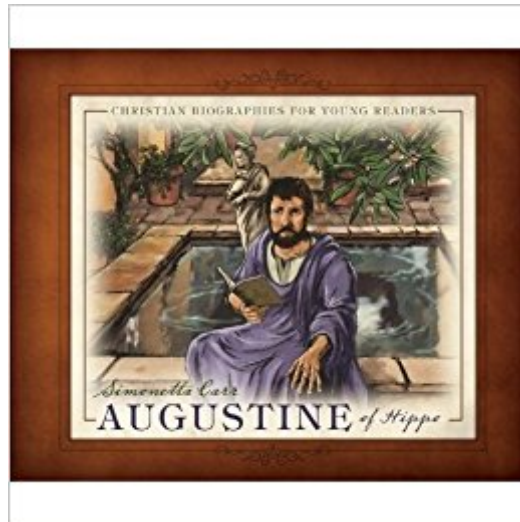




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Augustine Of Hippo (Christian Biographies For Young Readers)

I've just read Simonetta Carr's book about Augustine and was impressed at how much information there was about this often quoted man of early Christian history. It introduces our young people (and adults as well) to a man whose faith and wisdom have affected so many throughout the ages while describing the life and culture of that time in history. Mrs. Carr does a wonderful job describing Augustine's personal journey of recognizing his sinfulness amidst the various beliefs of that day to the struggle he endured in coming to finally surrender to Christ. It may be just the appetizer one needs before diving into Augustine's own writings. I would highly recommend it.

Very good, though not quite so visually interesting as other of Simonetta Carr's books in this series. Also, though she deals with all periods of Augustine's life, she might have given a tasteful paragraph, somehow, dealing more directly with his pre-conversion hedonism; readers who grow up to learn more about Augustine may look back at this book with slight confusion on the issue. Still, overall a really useful and engaging book! (Also, there is one glaring typo: the caption of one illustration reads "410 BC" when, obviously, it should be AD.)

Congratulations, Simonetta, on this clear production of the life of Augustine of Hippo. I'm sure that your readers will not only learn much about this eminent church father, but will also enjoy your writing style and the illustrations. I particularly liked your mixture of hand drawn illustrations with maps and photographs, which help to ground this tale in history. I hope that many young Christians will read your newest book in this admirable series (Christian Biographies for Young Readers).

Really enjoyed this book as I read it to my children. Gave lots of interesting detail and a timeline. At the back it has other interesting stories and highlights. The book is broken into 7 chapters, which can be read each day. It also includes wonderful engaging pictures that bring the story to life. I highly recommend it!

The book is well written and well illustrated, but has a serious and regrettable flaw; the language of the text imposes a Zwinglian view of baptism upon Augustine. This is historically inaccurate. Augustine did not believe that baptism is merely "God's mark of His work in our souls", (p.19). Nor did he believe that it's the prescribed way for a Christian to publically profess his faith, (p. 28, 31). Like all catholic Christians,(my use of the lower case "c" is intentional), Augustine believed baptism to be exactly what the Scriptures say: the sacrament by which Christ, working through His Body, the church, washes away our sins. The book has many positives, but brings with it the hazard of

misinforming young readers concerning a core belief of one of God's great teachers.

The visuals in this book are beautiful and it presents a nice history lesson. But I was disappointed in the text, and how often the writer used the word "wrong" to describe how Augustine thought about other religions. I doubt very much Augustine, highly educated in logic and rhetoric would have gone around thinking and saying something was "wrong" ... subtext being: "because the bible says so". Instead, Augustine wrote many books arguing his points using deductive reasoning, rather than thinking and speaking in ungrounded absolutes. So, this very important piece of the story was missing.

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
