

It's all well and good to do the women are equal storyline but you can't have it both ways. "I think you are a witch, Savannah, casting a spell over me." After a bit of a rocky start for me, I think this ended up being my favorite that I've read in the series so far. Ever since the first book I've been waiting to read Gregori's story. After seeing how he reacted when Mikhail and Jacques' lifemates challenged them or sought to be independent I was just waiting for him to finally melt for a female. Then when I found out that his lifemate was going to be none other than Mikhail and Raven's daughter I was even more excited. Ultimately the book was satisfying and I got to see all of the reactions I was hoping for out of Gregori as he and Savannah embarked on their new life together. Like I said though, things started out a bit rough and I

wasn't sure I was going to like it. If you read the first few books in this series then you know how powerful and dangerous Gregori is, amongst his people he is known as The Dark One and he has been dangerously close to turning vampire or meeting the dawn for quite a long time. Only the knowledge that his lifemate is out there is the only thing keeping him from doing that. Five years earlier Gregori claimed Savannah but it did not go well (imagine being 18yrs old and having to turn yourself over to someone as powerful and scary as him!) so he agrees to give her five years to live her life on her own before he will come to her. This sends Savannah to the US and she ends up being a travelling magician and living amongst the humans. Being that he has claimed his lifemate yet not fully merged the two of them, Gregori is very close to madness by the time he meets with Savannah again and of course Savannah is not any more willing to join with him than she was 5 years earlier. All of this leads to a few disturbing scenes between the two of them, one where Gregori's inner beast is released and he basically forces himself on her and in the process really hurts her. It was kind of horrifying and I couldn't see how they could work their way back from that. I thought the author did a good job of expressing Gregori's horror and guilt over what he's done, I could tell he truly felt awful for doing that and was prepared to end it all to spare her that violence again. I was a little surprised by how quickly Savannah got over all of that, but I guess the lifemate bond is stronger than anything a human can understand. "One who has gone centuries in utter darkness takes a long time to believe he will not lose the light." Once all of that is over with, I actually quite enjoyed the book. I really liked seeing Savannah trying to get him to see that there was more to him than just the monster he believed he was. There were a few very touching scenes between them as she made him believe what she saw in him. I also enjoyed the struggle between the two as Savannah sought to be partners and face the danger around them as a team and all he wanted to do was lock her away and keep her safe, in true Carpathian male style. It was interesting seeing a true Carpathian female for a change and not a human turned Carpathian so we didn't have that long period of denial over what she had become like there were in the prior books. But Savannah was a female Carpathian with a twist because she had been raised in the new era of Carpathians by a formerly human mother, that combined with having spent time in the human world herself, she understood and respected the Carpathian way of life but she also challenged it and sought to break some of the antiquated traditions. I liked that the standard formula from the first few books was mixed up a bit with this storyline. "Why did I want him to have a sense of humor?" she wondered. Gary shook his head. "Don't be asking me. You created the

He was always as powerful and dangerous as ever but he had this whole other side to him that Savannah brought out and it was lots of fun to see. I loved Gary and thought he was a great addition to the book, some of my favorite scenes were ones with the three of them together. There was also one really great scene with Aidan, from the previous book, who stops by and sees firsthand the effect Savannah has on Gregori and his reaction was hilarious.
