

I adored this book. I love humorous books, but they hardly ever make me laugh out loud; this one did. I'm a casual hockey fan, so you don't have to be an obsessed hockey nut or know all of the big hockey names to like this book. You've just gotta love an author who goes by the nickname

Noodles--what a likable, humble narrator. Fun, fast, interesting read, like a goaltender sat on the barstool next to you and started spinning stories--the kind of stories I tried to re-tell to my husband but laughed too much to make any sense. No, it's not Dostoevsky or Hawthorne. It's not trying to be. For what it is, five stars.

Jamie McLennan's book offers a badly needed insider's look into NHL life for any hockey fan tired of the same insipid lines from modern day NHL analysts, players and coaches ("We have to play a full 60 minutes", "He's a great teammate") via the standard media outlets (TV, newspapers, magazines, etc.). I think my only complaint is that the book was so engaging that it felt as though it was too short by the time I finished it.

There are some really funny stories in this book! My favorite was the one about Billy Smith telling him to guard his crease against a mascot. Great stuff! There's also a bare-knuckles review of his short stint in the KHL... a very different experience! I immediately sent it to a hockey buddy after I was done with it. It's a quick read, and well worth it.

The book is easy to read and has many entertaining hockey stories. The only drawback is that there is a lack of flow or continuity. It was as though Jamie would think of a story in a certain time period and that would be the chapter. Then on to the next chapter in another time era that could be back to Junior or with a particular NHL team.

Some interesting stories, but there always seemed to more information/facts/anecdotes for each section that were left out by the author. It felt a little incomplete and not organized well. For my money I'd suggest *JOURNEYMAN* by Sean Pronger for a more well written account of a career by a non-star NHL player.

I have a newfound respect for Jamie McLennan. If you're a hockey fan - you can't go wrong. And if you're not, you'll find a unique look into hockey which may turn you onto the game.

A great read from a funny ex-player. A very quick read too...wish there was more.

I really enjoyed this book. I found it much more narrative than Bob Miller's book which came across as a laundry list of anecdotes. It was really interesting to see things from a goalie's point of view.
