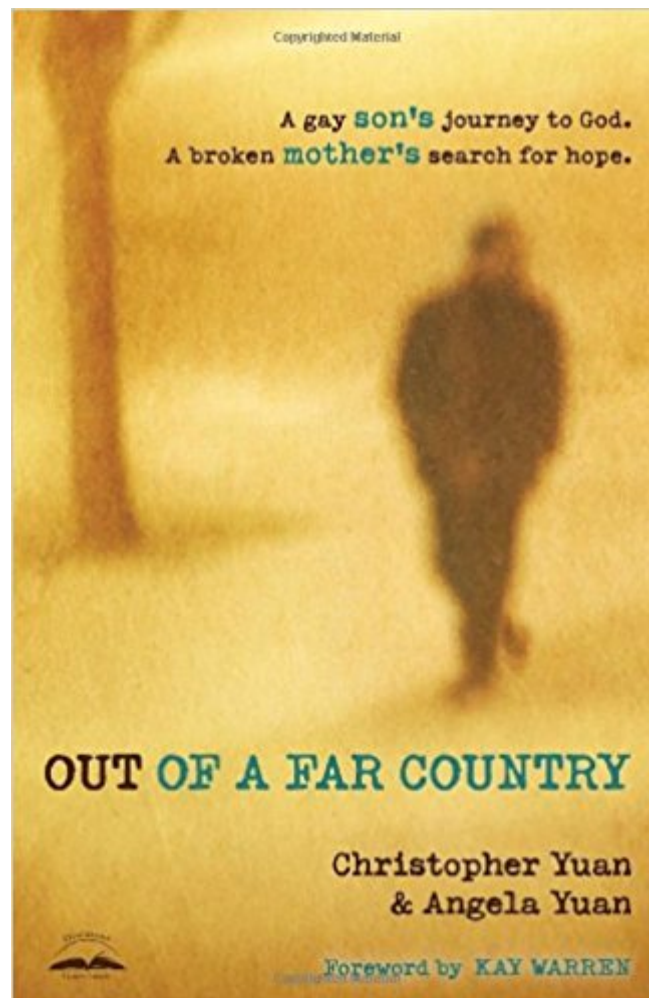

Christopher Yuan and Angela Yuan travel nationally and internationally to speak at churches, conferences, youth conventions, and colleges about God’s desire for prodigals of all types to return to him. Angela is a businesswoman and advocate for Chinese-American cultural causes. Christopher teaches at Moody Bible Institute (MBI). He holds a bachelor’s degree from MBI, a master’s degree in biblical exegesis from Wheaton College Graduate School and a doctorate of ministry from Bethel Seminary.

Two writers alternate telling their vastly different perspectives about the same events, making the story quite thought provoking and multi-dimensional. This book is not the work of skilled writers, but their stories, simply told, are heartfelt and moving.

I loved the candid reflections of the Yuans’ personal struggles. I would recommend this book to anyone and everyone. The Yuans’ family testimonies touch so many important issues and topics of today beyond homosexuality, prisons, and individual bias. I believe their fundamental point is knowing your God by having an intimate relationship with Him. Just a note, I would suggest looking at the study questions first before you read each chapter, it keeps it at the forefront of your mind.

As the mom of a gay son, the sister of a gay brother, and the friend of many wonderful gay and lesbian people, I read this book with a bit of reluctance, wondering if the conclusion of the story would be to condemn those in the LGBT community, or to conclude that Christians are somehow superior, and more loved by God, than those in the LGBT community. But gladly, Christopher and Angela’s story is just that: their own story, of their personal journey and experience with a faithful, loving God. It didn’t feel preachy or self-righteous, nor did it condemn others who have walked a different path. What the book did do was to give testimony to the way in which God is actively involved in our world, answering prayers and pursuing relationship with His children. I would

recommend it for anyone who would like to better understand the experience of addiction and/or the isolation that is often experienced by those who are gay or lesbian, and those who want to be reminded of how loving our God truly is.

I came across OUT OF A FAR COUNTRY by CHRISTOPHER YUAN AND ANGELA YUAN on . I was intrigued, and wanted to get a better understanding of what a gay man goes through, as well as his parents. Discovering Christianity was involved, sealed the deal. OUT OF A FAR COUNTRY sat on my bookshelf for months. While at a meeting at church, a man that joined our group mention a book a friend of his wrote that may be of interest, seeing we were involved in the prison and jail ministry. The title he mentioned sounded familiar, along with the author. When I returned home I rushed to my bookshelf to see if it were indeed the same book, and to my delight it was. The very next day I began to read OUT OF A FAR COUNTRY. Each morning I read a chapter out of my Bible, a chapter of non-fiction, and fiction throughout the day. OUT OF A FAR COUNTRY is like no other non-fiction I can recall reading. I couldn't put it down. It's probably the faster I've read a non-fiction book. Christopher Yuan had a secret, one he'd been carrying around for some time. When he decided to reveal that secret, that he's gay, his mother shows him the door. Angela Yuan loves her son, but being gay... Her first instinct is to give him an ultimatum. Be straight or get out. Angela was consumed with depression, disappointment, and sense of hopelessness. With every intention of ending her life, she sets out to say her good-byes to her son. OUT OF A FAR COUNTRY is a quick, easy read that is well written. One you will have a hard time putting down. I loved going from Christopher's point-of-view to Angela's. I even learned something new about an old song. This book is several stories in one: A gay mans journey in life. A mother's journey with a gay son. A journey through addictions. A journey through imprisonment. A redemption of a marriage. The journey of faithless to faithfulness. I highly recommend OUT OF A FAR COUNTRY to everyone, whether you know someone who is gay, you are, or aren't a Christian, you know someone that's incarcerated, you know someone that has little hope in their marriage, or someone with an addiction. This is a true story of hope and redemption. My hope is that people will pickup and read this book despite...or maybe because of, the gay aspect.

Very few people are able or willing to honestly peer through the window and into the world Christopher and Angela Yuan open for us. This is more than an interesting recounting of two perspectives on a journey of life through faith and homosexuality. It is not a comforting book. Many, if not most, will have a difficult time embracing the testimony of the Yuans. Some Christians who have been reared in conservative environments will bristle at Christopher's refusal to deny that he was born with same-sex attraction. Proponents of the gay lifestyle will bristle with Christopher's ultimate decision on how to live with his homosexuality. Angela's prayers and deep expression of love for her son run counter-culture to modern day political and social correctness in how to embrace a gay child. The lessons of the book are plentiful. It's a primer for a greater understanding of those who wrestle with homosexuality. It's also a modern day story of the prodigal son. Angela is an example, regardless of the trouble in the lives of our children, of how to be a loving, patient and supportive parent. Christopher's conversion is a shining example of God's grace while the effects of HIV are a reminder the consequences of our actions follow us throughout our lives. Very few will be able to read this book without some change of perspective. I highly recommend it.
