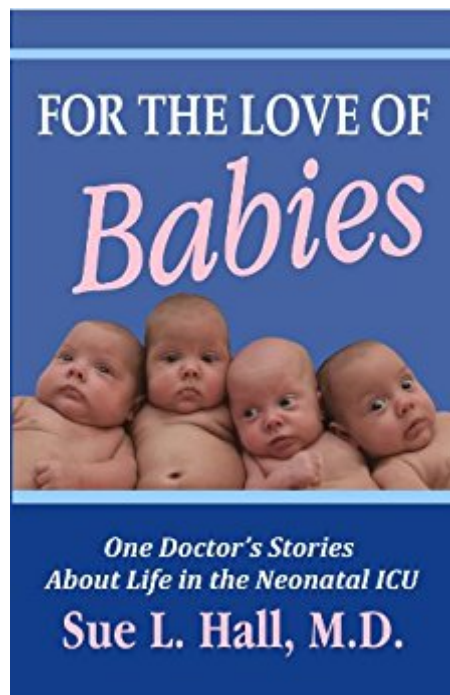




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For The Love Of Babies: One Doctor's Stories About Life In The Neonatal ICU

She expertly weaves the social and emotional threads of each family's journey into their baby's story, and also speaks candidly about the stresses and difficult decisions that neonatologists and their tiny patients' parents routinely face. Taken all together, the sixteen stories give an insightful, vivid and moving portrayal of life in the high-stakes world of the neonatal intensive care unit. This book is for anyone who has wondered how doctors and nurses work under intense pressure to diagnose and treat the smallest of patients, and how parents of these infants cope with the emotional ups and downs that are part the daily rhythms of life in the NICU.

A deeply loving and compassionate book, for me, it was a revelation, an access to an unfamiliar and often frightening world, a world parents would not choose to enter. Dr. Sue Hall offers a series of short stories that are moving in their ability to introduce the reader to diverse families and babies. We journey with them through their difficult times. We journey with the doctors and nurses as they work under many pressures, see how they approach and make difficult decisions. Dr. Hall is able to hold the reader's attention with her clear prose and her ability to reveal frustrations and vulnerability, humility and triumphs and in doing so, she elicits both an emotional and intellectual response. I was fascinated to learn of the social contexts in which the hospitals exist and the history of neonatal care and related ethics. There is interesting additional information and links that many readers will find helpful. Importantly, the short stories feel safe to read.
