

This book focuses on the households of Charles and Diana, the Princes and Princess Michael of Kent, Princess Margaret, and the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester when they all lived in Kensington Palace. It's interesting to learn that for the most part none of these family members liked

each other and had little to do with each other beyond each spying on the other and snarking about what each did. This book is certainly not a historic account but it is harmless fun for those who enjoy reading about those who we perceive to live more privileged lives than we do.
