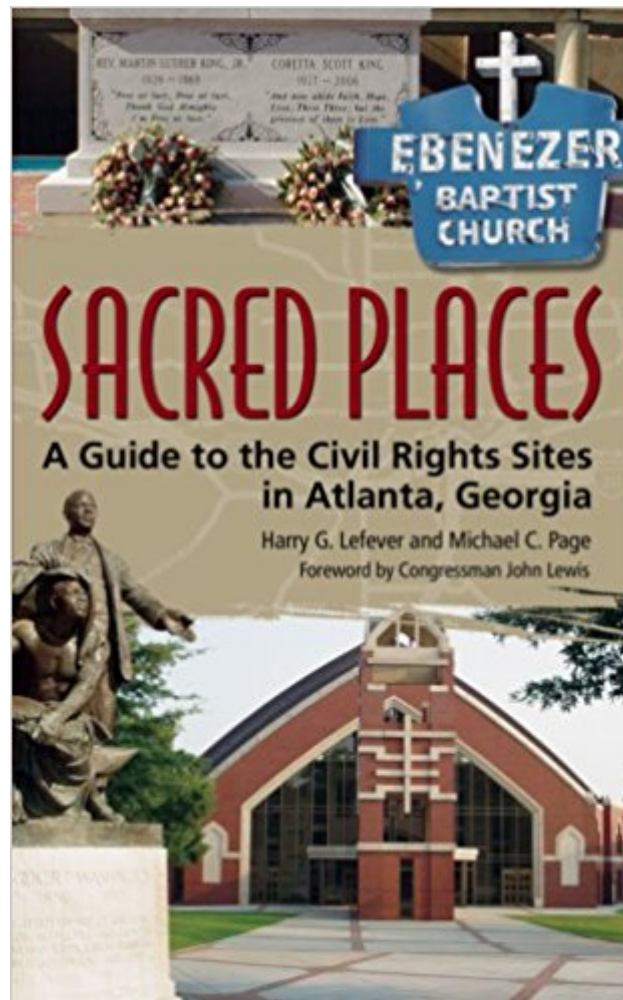

He has published two books, *Turtle Bogue: Afro-Caribbean Life and Culture in a Costa Rican Village* (1992) and *Undaunted by the Fight: Spelman College and the Civil Rights Movement, 1957-1967* (2005). He also has published numerous articles in the *Anthropology and Humanism Quarterly*, *Sociological Analysis*, *Atlanta Historical Journal*, *Journal for the Scientific Study of Religion*, *Labor History*, and the *South Eastern Latin Americanist*. Page, an Atlanta native, resides in Atlanta with his wife and four children.
