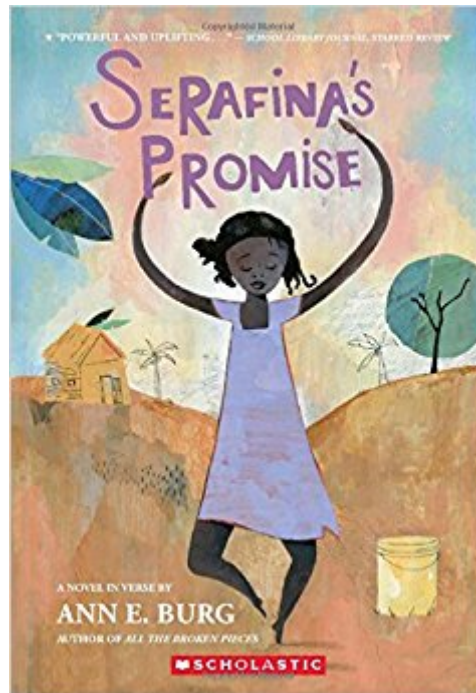




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Serafina's Promise

Serafina is an 11-year-old Haitian struggling to keep her dream of becoming a doctor alive. Living in a desolate mountain village, Serafina toils at her daily chores while planning to attend school in the requisite uniform and shoes. Serafina has a warm family, a true friend in Julie Marie, and an encouraging woman doctor, who all come to support her vision. Then a flood washes away the family home, and the roaring stampede of an earthquake devastates the city of Port-au-Prince, where Serafina's father works and Julie Marie lives. In this novel in verse, the author of the acclaimed *All the Broken Pieces* (2009) uses a lush narrative bouquet, filled with blooms of quiet verse, rhythmic Creole, and Haitian proverbs and sayings that capture life's poignancy and hardships, including a message that Serafina has learned from an early age: "If you want

your eggs to hatch, sit on them yourself. In Burg's lyrical tale, Serafina is a force of nature in her own right who carries her family, friends, and dreams to safe ground. Grades 5-8.

My hope was to find a book that accurately depicted all that I had seen and experienced there so that I could share it with others beyond my own story. It did not disappoint and I found myself in tears as I read. The free verse is moving and the descriptions of life, education, hope, depravity, and culture transported me back to the beloved island. This story will open your eyes to another world- the reality that many people live in throughout the world, endearing you to its characters, country and theme. Great for adults and youth alike.

I'm using this book in my 6th grade classroom. We are doing a global unit (connecting four different classrooms in three separate continents, all reading the same literature). One of my partner's students is from Haiti and suggested we include this book. What a great addition to our unit. Serafina shows readers how valued education is and what one will do and sacrifice to get an education. For Serafina, education is a privilege, not a right. Our students need to understand how blessed they are that they are handed this ticket while many millions in our world can not say the same. This book is beautifully written and contains many important messages. I would recommend for grades 5 and up. If using in the classroom, be prepared to share background information about environmental issues in Haiti.
