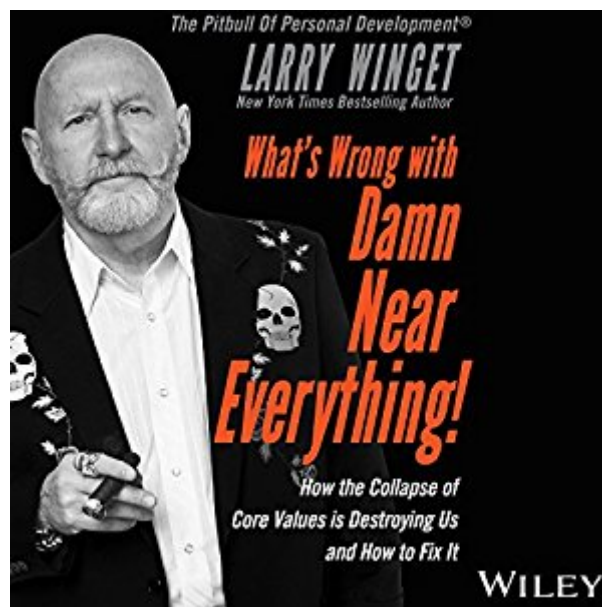




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What's Wrong With Damn Near Everything!: How The Collapse Of Core Values Is Destroying Us And How To Fix It

As a preface, I have read and own three of his prior books, "Shut Up, Stop Whining & Get a Life," "It's Called Work for a Reason," and "Grow a Pair." So, the title of his new book, as always, did not disappoint. I read the book, in one sitting ... I couldn't put it down ... and found myself raising an eyebrow, laughing, grimacing, smiling, and even responding out loud, as if I was having a conversation with Larry and applauding many of his comments (similar to viewers cheering on a character when watching a movie)! Primarily because he's speaking to each and every one of us ... each and every reader who has a "pair" to pick up a copy of this book and read it cover to cover. He cares deeply about the people he serves when he speaks and when he writes. It is simply that he understands there is too much pandering, self-deception and willful ignorance in our culture. The only way we can address our problems is to face them or directly. That's Winget's gift. Now you, like me, may find yourself in complete agreement with What's Wrong with Damn Near Everything!
