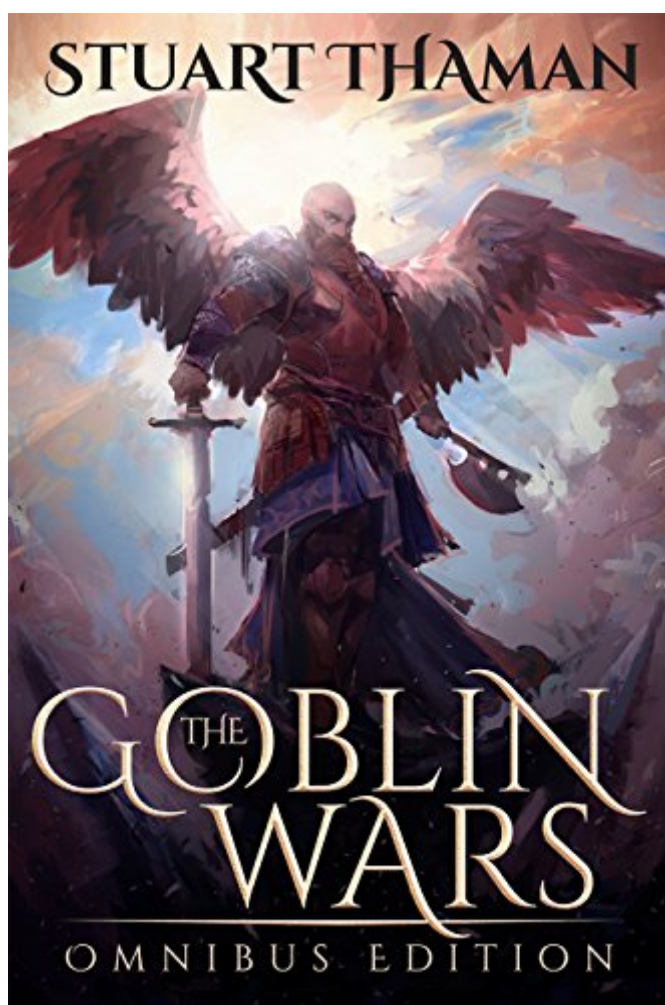


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The Goblin Wars Complete Trilogy: Omnibus Edition (Three Epic Fantasy Books)

There are things I found very fresh and new but still had some things that were quite traditional for a fantasy book which I liked. I love that the goblins are portrayed to be hive like. Very cool concept for goblins.

This is a fitting third book to this trilogy. The plot takes quite a few turns with surprises. The final victor is a surprise as well. Definitely worth reading.

I have to admit it was difficult for me to tackle an omnibus and give a fair review. Especially since this type of fantasy is a little outside of my usual fare. Having said that, there were things I really liked about this epic fantasy. I liked the author's take on the goblins. Who knew they lived in a hive-like society? There were many fantastical creatures to sort through. Some were as I might have expected them to be, and others were full of surprises. It kept me interested and guessing. The action scenes held me captive. They had me cringing, and trying to read faster to find out what would happen. Darkness never seems to be very far away. And the twist at the end left me a little unsettled. The writing is very good. I may check out this author again. But one book at a time, I think! I received an ARC of this book, and this is my honest and voluntary review.

Rated 3 1/2 stars... Read and reviewed as a Hidden Gem selection, THE GOBLIN WARS was a good story. A very unique and interesting plot with many twists and turns, but the story felt like a roller coaster ride that at times seemed to get bogged down and stuck at times. Also, as the story plodded along it was difficult to hard identify and empathize with the characters and what they were experiencing. It difficult to clearly define heroes and villains and by the end I was pretty disgusted with most of the characters even though I did want Gideon, Gravlox and Vorst to be triumphant. The Goblin Wars Trilogy has a following and many fans who adore it. The great thing is it is offered on KU so you can read it for free first and decide for yourself where you land. $\hat{\wedge}$.

I really enjoyed this. Sometimes with fantasy it can fall flat and seem like it has been done before, but this book had some elements that I haven't seen done all that often. There was still a lot of

traditional fantasy elements, but it was all very well done. I found it an engaging book, though slow at some points. I both liked and disliked how everything just jumped right into the story with no beginning back story. Personally I like all kinds of world building and backstory, but it probably would have bogged this story down. One of my favorite elements of this book was the concept of the goblins. The hive-like society was very interesting, and like I mentioned before, something I found to be a new element to me. The action scenes were also well done. I do have a bit of a gripe with the names though. I found them to be rather silly. I wasn't too fond of the narrative or the several breaks headed by a graphics. But still this was a good book. If you like fantasy novels I recommend picking up the first book in the trilogy, maybe don't pick up all the books all together. I voluntarily reviewed this book for an ARC.

I was selected as an ARC reader for this book. It did take me longer to read it than it should have because the plot was complex and I couldn't always figure out where it was leading. By the end I realized that there was actually two main stories happening at the same time with different endings. It was amazing, and I look forward to more work from this author. The characters were complex and changing and things didn't always go the way I thought or wanted them to but the ending was spectacular. The last 150 pages I couldn't set the book down and powered through them. It was an exciting experience full of questions and thrill that I can only say Tolkien, Rowling, and Christie have given in book form at least to me. It's definitely worth the time and money.

I'm having a change of pace by reading this sort of novel well in this case an omnibus. I like my reads every now and then I wasn't let down by this one. What an awesome take on Goblins and the other fantastical creatures. I found myself rushing ahead at some points in the book just so I could find out what was happening next.
