

151 Days is a gay coming of age tale well told. It features likable characters written strongly. It features a plot that makes you keep turning the pages. The loving teen couple at the center of the action are really put to the test, and the story features some very serious developments. But the boys are up to the task, and it's exciting to see them develop and grow. The Foster High series is excellent. My only complaint is the retelling of the same events from multiple characters' perspectives. 151 Days sometimes gets bogged down in going through the same events with

different characters as the narrator. I think the book would have been better served to have the plot keep moving forward at all times, instead of occasionally backward. But overall, I strongly recommend 151 Days and the Foster High series.

I have read all of the Tales of Foster High Series and enjoyed each one. This last tome is epic. It is long, intense, and richly woven. I have so much respect for Mr. Goode's ability as an author to bring to life a time and a place so vividly. It took me three days to read this book. I had to put it aside several times, reading it in chunks, in order to process my own feelings in relation to the story. Scenes from the previous books in the series were revisited in such a way as to give the reader a greater understanding of the characters, settings and events in the previous books. Even writing this review has taken me a couple of days in order to really let the book settle in. The author's note at the end sheds light on why this series (and particularly this book) have been so emotional and real. Thank you for your candour, Mr. Goode. While this is the end of the tales of Foster High since the book culminates in the graduation of the two main characters, Brad and Kyle, we are left with the notion that the place has changed for the better thanks to them. Also with the knowledge that we haven't heard the last of all of the characters, though we will no longer hang out in the halls of Foster High as readers. I look forward to more tales about Brad and Kyle and any of the other characters that the author might want to share with his readers.

151 Days takes place during the last couple of months of Kyle & Brad's High School senior year. And those last months are not only told through their eyes, but also through the POVs of most of the characters we have come across during this series. And through their perspectives it allowed us to see them in a different light. But most importantly it shows us that it's never too late. After finishing this book there's no way I could see this quote and not think of Kyle. "I alone can't change the world, but I can cast a stone across the waters to create ripples." -Mother Theresa Perfect ending was perfect! I'm just in awe with Mr. Goode's writing ability.
