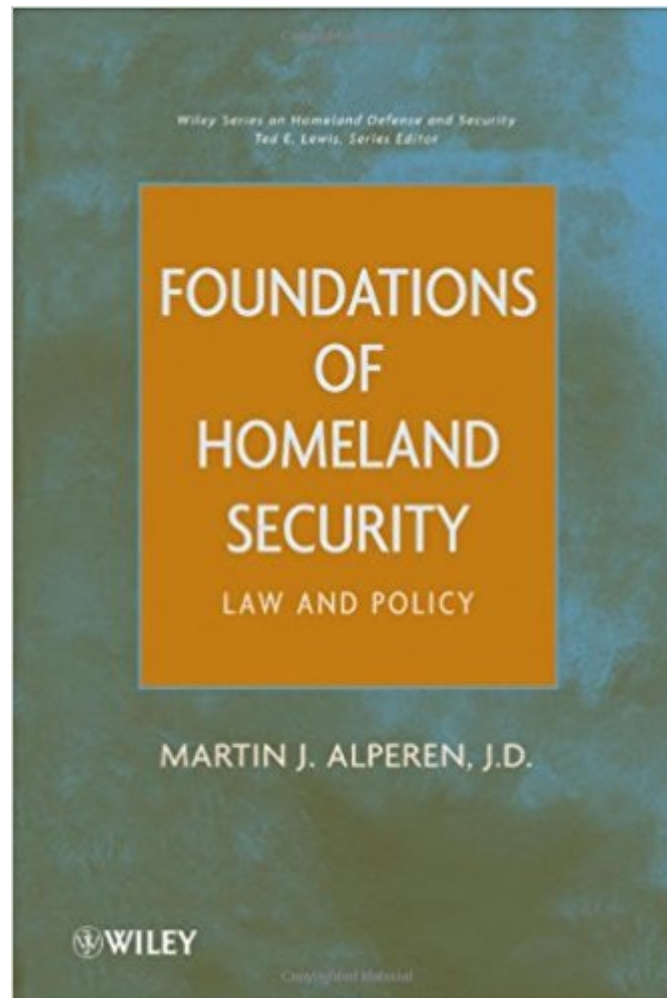




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Foundations Of Homeland Security: Law And Policy



Synopsis

This book is the complete guide to understanding the structure of homeland security and its underlying law and policy. Created from a broad and in depth, yet edited collection of statutes, policy papers, presidential directives, and other documents, it cultivates a detailed understanding of the foundations of homeland security. It is arranged in a topic-by-topic format structured to include only the documents and statutes that affect a particular subject, making for much easier understanding. Thus, the chapter on FEMA contains only the portions of the statutes and other documents that relate to FEMA. There are twenty-five topic areas. It contains hundreds of end notes, references, and suggestions for further study. This book offers important legal guidance that students, law enforcement officers, lawyers, and other homeland security professionals need to accurately interpret, understand, and apply homeland security policy. The Introduction provides an in-depth overview of the subject of homeland security and includes a discussion of what is homeland security, definitions of homeland security and terrorism, what is homeland security law, its development, and what is a homeland security curriculum. There are contributing chapters about homeland security in Europe, and homeland security in China and Japan.

Purchased this book for a graduate class, the title says it all but the contents are impressive. The author must have gone through an endless amount of information and policies in making the book. Granted this is not a type of book you sit down to leisurely read. The contents are fact filled, meaning it is law after law in respect to the policy and what and why it is in place. It's boring, to read like any another book. For resources and explanations of policies and why they were enacted it is outstanding. Currently there is not another book on the market that even comes close to the amount of detail and subject matter this one contains. In my studies and not being familiar with the vast amount of laws that limit or promote my expertise I am reassured every time I open the book. It obtains the straight to the point legislation and resources I need, without the junk.

All of what was in this book you could easily find through Google. There was very little synthesis or

explanation of what the laws entailed or lead to, but instead just the wording of the laws themselves. While the laws are the foundations, I didn't expect to read about them in a graduate level course, nor did I expect them to just be handed to us. We could have just as easily looked at US code and just read section and saved the money. The chapters on how other countries look at security were insightful and I wish more of the book were set up in that way.

Given the variety of homeland security authorities for each subject matter topic, this new edition is an excellent source for students and practitioners.

As a homeland security professor and author, I found Dr. Alperen's book touched on some very key points that many other authors gloss over. While he discusses terrorism, his notes that homeland security is more than just addressing terrorism, a term few federal agencies can define with any agreement. I also found the additional information of the approaches taken regarding homeland security (though it is not always referred to by those words) in other nations, such as China, and Europe, in general. In that regard, I especially appreciate Chapter One, which does an excellent job of introducing the subject.
