

Created in 1916, and encompassing 45,000 acres on two islands and a mainland peninsula on the rugged coast of Maine, Acadia National Park is a jewel of granite mountains, filigreed coastlines, unique cultural resources, dazzling night skies, and precious communities of plant and animal life. Drawing more than 2.5 million visitors each year, Acadia is one of the ten most popular national parks in the United States. The only illustrated book officially published with the Friends of Acadia, this stunning portfolio of photographs reveals Acadia's diverse habitats and brings home the contrasts of pounding ocean and silent coves, bald mountain summits and deep forest valleys, as never before seen. The essays convey the unseen story of Acadia: its history as a national park; the critical role of the founding families in its creation; the past and current importance of private stewardship; and its status as a unique park forged in a particular time and place in history. Acadia National Park celebrates the essence of this special place and offers a cherished journey into its past, present, and future.

This coffee table book is a tour de force that does justice to this magnificent national park, with nice large crisp beautiful photographs that portray both the intimacy of the park as well as it's beautiful landscapes and wild life. What a great celebration of the centennial of this magical place.

In 2016, Acadia National Park celebrated its centennial. This book is its official publication, a short collection of essays commemorating the birth of Acadia, its continuing relevance as a place of remarkable physical beauty, and its somewhat competing destiny as one of the popular, and most visited, national parks. The bulk of the book is given over to a superb collection of color photographs by Tom Blagden. The photos cover the main park and its satellite portions on Isle Au Haut and the Schoodic Peninsula. They are breathtaking, an invitation to come see the sights in person, and a warning of how fragile is the park if it is not cared for in its second 100 years. "Acadia National Park"

is highly recommended as a souvenir of the park.

We actually saw this book at our Bed & Breakfast in Bar Harbor and ordered it from right then and there. We were in Acadia every day for a week and I can tell you this book captures the majesty and allure better than any we've seen.
