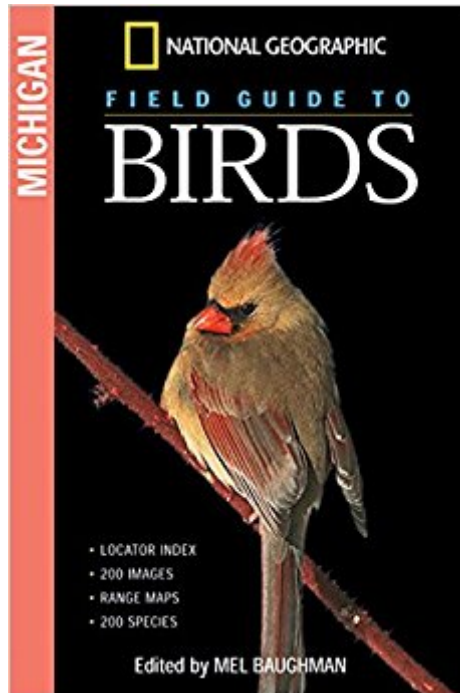

If you live in Michigan and like bird watching you have to get this book. I have been able to identify many birds and it is nice that I can just stick it in my pocket. The book contains real pictures so it's easier to identify birds and it also has the birds indexed by their color, so if you see a bird and you don't know what it is, you can simply look at a list of birds of that particular color. One thing this book lacks is information about birds, it's kind of basic in that area. However, it is a pocket field guide and should be treated as such. For more information on a bird's behavior and biology there are other full size books available.

My mother-in-law moved to a new part of the state, so we got her this book so she could identify the birds at her bird feeders. Her husband said it was stupid, but within weeks he was grabbing the book to look up birds that were outside the window, too! The book is comprehensive, but it can sometimes be difficult to find a specific bird, especially because it does not feature photos of both male and females of the species.

This is a nice little colorful book. Note I said "little" . I didn't carefully read the description of the size of this book. Because it is pocket size it is a little difficult to actually see the picture. Sometimes it is easier to identify from a photo rather than written word. However, for the price, it's worth it!
